ast June NCRD's own Jim McDemott won first prize in the Northern California Underwater Photographic Society's annual California Beach Dive Photo Contest in Monterey. Jim's prize was a weeklong liveaboard trip on the Peter Hughes Antares Dancer. Early last month, Jim spent a week diving in the Los Roques archipelago, located 105 miles due north of Caracas off the coast of Venezuela and 100 miles east of Bonaire. The more than 880 square miles of Los Roques

was declared a national park in 1972 and is the oldest marine park in the Caribbean.

Jim has generously agreed to share some of his underwater photography from the trip with the club. We are indeed fortunate to have Jim's talent to give us a glimpse of this little-traveled dive destination. So, you won't want to miss the April meeting featuring Jim's slide presentation. ...being able to wear my lycra dive suit as much as I wanted (including dripping wet in the dining hall after my night snorkle).


...making baby talk to Dolphins who are probably smarter than me. They certainly can swim better.

...remembering life without stress.


...living on island time.

...how incredibly cool our "one woman" was the whole trip.


...flirting openly with Casper the waiter and half hoping he really does come to visit.












NCRD May 27 Pt. Lobos Dives





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
